Determination of NT-pro-BNP helps to identify subjects with left ventricular dysfunction. Changes in NT-proBNP concentration can be used to evaluate the success of treatment in patients with left ventricular dysfunction. There are indication that NT-proBNP functions are suitable for use in assessing vascular remodelling and therefore it's contributes to the establishment of individualized rehabilitation procedures.
