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Interpretation:

A reactive VDRL test in conjunction with positive blood serology is a specific indicator for neurosyphilis. The sensitivity is very low (<50%), therefore a nonreactive VDRL result should be confirmed with other associated tests.

Clinical background :

CSF VDRL is a slide flocculation test. Tests of the CSF (VDRL quantitative) be performed in :Neurosyphilis, all cases of congenital syphilis, any syphilis patients with

- 1• Neurologic or ophthalmic signs or symptoms
- 2• Evidence of active tertiary syphilis (e.g., aortitis, gumma, and iritis)
- 3• Treatment failure
- 4• HIV infection with late latent or syphilis of unknown duration or immuno-compromised patients

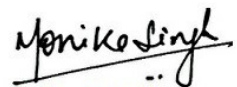
