Interpretation:

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1. The quantitation of CK-MB levels in serum is used as an aid in the diagnosis of myocardial injury. 2. Other condition causing elevated CK-MB levels include skeletal muscle trauma, dermatomyositis, Duchenne's muscular dystrophy, Reye's syndrome, rhabdomyolysis, drug overdoses, delirium tremens, or chronic alcohol poisoning.
